

The Jesuit in Me.....



# Development & Action Activities

# **ADB Project**

The Asian Development Bank Project named "Implementation of Environmental and Social safeguards for Madhya Pradesh Power Sector Investment Programme, ADB Loan no. 3066 IND under MPPTCL" is still in progress. As of now 6 monitoring reports were delivered. The final Environmental Due Diligence (DDR) related work and data entry and analysis of various Divisions' line and substations of MPPTCL are to commence in June-July 2021. The functional team for the project consists of Dr. Uma C. Saha, Dean, Fr. Binod Toppo, SJ, Project Coordinator; Mr. Puskar Pande, Consultant and Mr. Pushpendra Tiwari, Institute's Professional Staff.

#### **HDFC Need Assessment Projects**

There were two HDFC Need Assessment Projects carried out in the month of April and May 2021. First was the "Need Assessment of 2nd Phase of HRDP in ten villages of Lateri Block of Vidisha District, MP" coordinated by Dr. J.R. Jha and Pushpendra Tiwari during the month of

March 2021. The final report was written by Dr. Uma C. Saha under the guidance of Dr. Fr. Alexius Ekka, SJ and duly submitted on 3rd June 2021.

### IGSS, New Delhi

The second Need Assessment Study was requested by IGSSS, New Delhi. It was entitled "Creating Sustainable Communities under holistic rural development programme in 15 villages of Khandwa and Pandhana Blocks of Madhya Pradesh." Dr. Jogendra Pathak and Mr. Kundan Mishra coordinated the study from the end of March 2021 to the first week of April 2021. Dr. Jogendra Pathak wrote the report under the guidance of Dr. Fr. Alexius Ekka, SJ and duly submitted it in the month of May 2021.

### **HCL Projects**

The HCL Foundation is committed to strengthen and empower the NGOs in the field of Environment, Health, and Education in the selected states of India as part of its CSR activities. Under this CSR

Programme it called for proposals in the aforesaid three sectors, consequently XIDAS submitted two project proposals – first "Initiatives to improve teaching standards and inclusion of the disadvantaged section in Anganwadi Wadi Centres and Schools of Rural Madhya Pradesh: with special emphasis to Jabalpur, Mandla and Seoni districts" covering the Education Sector; and

second "Inventorization of Aves, Conservation of Habitat, Developing a Birding Site and Livelihood Improvement of the Communities in the Buffer Zone of the Bandhavgarh National Park, Madhya Pradesh" covering the Environment Sector for the HCL Grant Edition VII. The proposal was under discussion to be submitted online in the following month and presently is in the pipeline for approval.


### **Studies**

#### Online Classes










## **Admission Drive Online**


